District 10 May Newsletter

Dear Neighbor,

About a month ago, I began my newsletter by stating that I hate graffiti, and voiced my frustrations regarding the blight that it brings to our neighborhoods. Well, last Saturday, April 26th, my staff and I, along with over 160 volunteers from all over District 10, decided to do something about it!

For several months, my office staff had been planning The Great American Litter Pick Up, and bright and early Saturday morning, dozens of volunteers descended upon the 6 staging sites throughout the District to pick up litter, remove graffiti, brush up some landscaping, plant a tree, and paint a half-mile long sound wall that has been the target of tagging for a long time! The event was a tremendous success!

At Almaden Community Center, neighbors of the Center and members of the Almaden Swim and Racquet Club came out to pull weeds, clean up litter, and spread fresh wood chips in the flower beds around the campus. They did a fantastic job sprucing the place up! Just a stones-throw away, neighbors were joined by young people and adults from the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, members of the Assyrian-American Association, brothers of the California Zeta Chapter of Sigma Alpha Epsilon at San Jose State University, and staff from the City of San Jose's Anti-Graffiti and Litter Program, diligently painted the entire stretch of sound wall along Almaden Road, from Kelez to Bose. The former multi-colored and blotched wall that had been the target of graffiti is now one, solid color, and the blight has been removed!



At Pioneer High School and Del Roble Elementary School, YMCA staff led a great effort in picking up litter and removing graffiti from street signs, light poles, and utility boxes. In the Hoffman-Via Monte neighborhood near Pioneer, volunteers collected 93 bags of trash and 20 shopping carts! A majority of those volunteers were children and families from Almaden Elementary. What a great opportunity to get kids involved and to teach them how to take ownership of their community! Del Roble was a great success as well, with Principal Yolanda Ross joining the effort!

In the VEP and Playa Del Rey neighborhoods, volunteers collected upwards of 23 bags of trash, removed graffiti, raked up leaves and pine needles, and planted a tree! In addition to the volunteer efforts, my office requested the clean up of the medians along Camden Avenue, and thanks to the Department of Transportation, they were all spruced up! Thanks to everyone who participated, and a special thank you to Yellow Cab of Silicon Valley for donating the funds to feed all of our volunteers! District 10 residents have proven once again their dedication and commitment to making our community great!

Today, I submitted a memo to the City Council requesting that the Council's public hearing for the proposed Brasilia Way development be postponed to June 10th. District 10 residents and members of the planning commission expressed concerns about the 12 native oak trees that would be removed. I heard these valid concerns and have asked the developer to work with the City's Planning and Public works departments to see how the project might be modified in order to preserve additional native oak trees. Deferring the item to June 10th will give the developer and City staff adequate time to figure out how additional trees might be preserved. HOMEOWNERS INSURANCE – WHAT DOES YOUR POLICY COVER?

You may already know that property owners in San Jose are responsible for the sidewalks, curbs, and gutters in front of their properties. Some homeowners are also responsible for the sound wall that runs across their property. You may also be responsible for what happens on that sidewalk, curb, gutter, and sound wall, depending upon the circumstances, so I recommend that you double-check with your homeowners or business insurance agent, or take a look at your policy, to ensure that you are adequately insured and that your policy covers these places.

Special Parcel Tax Exemption Available for Seniors

Exemption enrollment period is now open and runs through June 30, 2014

The Santa Clara Valley Water District offers an exemption for qualifying low-income seniors from the 15-year Safe, Clean, Water Creeks special parcel tax. This tax was approved by Santa Clara County voters in November of 2012.

The exemption allows the district to remove the charge from a qualifying senior household's property tax bill. Currently, the charge is around \$55 for a single family home and \$23 for a townhouse or condo. Seniors 65 years and older can apply for the exemption if they live in their own home as their primary residence. Please note that mobile homes in parks, and homes that are in an irrevocable trust, are not eligible for this exemption.

The enrollment period is April 15, and all new applications must be received by the water district by June 30 to be exempted for the upcoming property tax year. Residents who miss the enrollment period must wait for the next year.

Once a resident has submitted the application, there is no need to re-apply every year. In the spring, usually by the end of March or early April, the district will send the resident a letter to verify eligibility. Once the resident has returned the verification form for ongoing eligibility, the water district will remove the resident's property from the property tax roll for the Safe, Clean Water charge for the next property tax year.

Linda LeZotte, our representative on the Santa Clara Valley Water District, announced that the Santa Clara Valley Water District is now accepting video and poster entries for its youth media contest until May 12. This contest is a way to create and increase awareness among Santa Clara County youth to contribute to water-saving efforts and to help respond to the severe drought that California is facing.

Entries should focus on water conservation tips and show easy ways to save water in response to the California drought. One of the goals is to get the younger generation to think about sustainability of water and to help them adopt and promote a water-efficient lifestyle. Contest entrants must be residents of Santa Clara County and can compete in two categories – video and/or poster. Each category has two age groups – between the ages of 14 to 18 and 19 to 24. Entries may be a team or individual effort.

Contestants are encouraged to create new and original graphics, visual elements, or concepts to convey the contest theme, as long as the message tips are gathered from the save20gallons.org site.

All entries may be submitted with a completed entry form until midnight May 12, 2014. The contest entry form, complete contest rules and criteria are available online at www.valleywater.org/youthcontest.

The winners will be recognized at a special awards ceremony in late May at the water district headquarters. First prize winners will receive a cash prize of \$250 in each category for each age group. 2014 San José Gira de Libro

The San José Public Library (SJPL) is teaming up with San José Bike Clinic to present the 2014 San José Gira de Libro, the first ever SJPL bicycle tour.

The name of the ride, Gira de Libro, is a play on the name of the famous Italian professional road bike stage race, Giro d'Italia, which starts May 9 and ends June 1. The San José Gira de Libro roughly translates from Spanish to "turns of the book" or "book tour."

A guided community and staff bicycle ride that will visit seven of San José's twenty-three branch libraries, the Gira de Libro is will start and finish at the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Library, 150 E. San Fernando St., in downtown San José.

The San Jose's Gira de Libro starts 10 a.m., Sat., May 10 with sign-in and a bicycle safety check. For safety purposes, registration is required and the ride will be limited to 75 participants. The ride will stop at each library to regroup; the total distance is 25km (15.5 miles). We invite you to ride with us and enjoy the City of San José's libraries and bikeways.
