Rincon South Master Plan	3	On December 13th, the City Council approved the <b>Rincon South Master Plan</b> and the name of " <b>Rincon South</b> " for the new park. The next step is for the City to prepare the construction documents and bid the project. Construction of the project should start in the Fall of 2017 and be completed before June 30, 2018.
Family Camp at Yosemite	Citywide	Next week the City Council will award a construction contract for the <b>Family Camp Workshop Replacement Project</b> at \$178,928 to Southwest Property Management and Construction, Inc. This project will replace the workshop/storage barn that was lost in the 2013 Rim Fire. This project will complete the efforts to rebuild the structures lost from Fire.
Family Camp at Yosemite	Citywide	"Fire Up and Friendraiser" event for Family Camp on Saturday, January 28 <sup>th</sup> at Kelley Park. If you attend you get early-bird registration. [Hand out postcards]
Backesto Park	3	On February 7 <sup>th</sup> , the City Council should award a construction contract for <b>Backesto Park</b> at \$446,341 to Integra Construction Service, Inc. for repairs the two restroom buildings, exterior repairs to the Re-Use Building including a new roof, install a lighted dirt volleyball court, rearrange the picnic areas, install Para course equipment to the Park and hang the Don Johnson Tennis Courts signs.
Southside Community Center	2	This month, the City will begin a small addition to the Restrooms associated with Multi-Purpose Room at the <b>Southside Community Center</b> . This project will enhance the movability with two restroom spaces and hopefully will resolve the many years of patron's complaints.
Willow Street Frank Bramhall Park	6	On December 13 <sup>th</sup> the City Council awarded a construction contract for the <b>Bramhall Park Lawn Bowling Green Renovation Project</b> to Goodland Landscape Construction, Inc. for \$1,104,350 to do a total renovation of the existing lawn bowling facility. Construction should begin when the weather is dry and completion should occur in late summer.
Downtown	3	On December 13 <sup>th</sup> the City Council approved " <b>Actions related to the Extension of the Downtown High-Rise Incentive Program</b> " by keeping the Parkland Fees charged for residential downtown high-rise developments of 12 stories or higher at fifty percent (50%) of the applicable Parkland Fees for multi-family 5+ units in the Downtown Area





# Los Lagos Golf Course Community Outreach Project

The City of San Jose Department of Parks, Recreation and Neighborhood Services (PRNS) has started a community engagement process to develop a vision for the future of the Los Lagos Golf Course site that reflects community values, concerns, and needs. During the early part of 2017, we will be working to gather input from the community and present recommendations to the City for the Golf Course site.

## What is Los Lagos Golf Course?

The 18-hole Los Lagos Golf Course is one of three municipal courses in the City of San Jose. It is located in City Council District 7 and situated along Coyote Creek. It is a Certified Audubon Cooperative Sanctuary course. The Course was developed in 2002 to accommodate local and regional recreational needs.

## What is this project about?

The City is committed to maximizing the public value of the golf course site. It is leading an outreach effort to hear directly from the diverse District 7 and City of San Jose communities whether the Golf Course best meets local needs and interests—if so, how? If not, why not? This is a broad outreach effort that includes workshops, pop-up events, and a survey to help develop a vision for a potential future use of the Golf Course site. Depending on public feedback, this potential future use may be similar or different than the current 18-hole golf course.

## Who is involved?

The Department of PRNS is managing this outreach effort. A recommendations report based on feedback from the community will be presented to the Parks and Recreation Commission, Neighborhood Services and Education Committee, and City Council.



Dear Director Rios:

At the December Parks and Recreation Commission meeting, PRNS Staff presented the results of the Parks Conditions Assessment. The results quantify that San Jose Parks are not in good condition. Staff highlighted trends and indicated analytic strategies that lay ahead leveraging Business Intelligence (BI) data. As a trained statistician, I was excited that staff was using advanced analytic techniques, e.g. linear regression, to model differences in park conditions. My mind was immediately whirring with potential analytic approaches and metrics that could result. Staff asked the Commission for feedback. Since the public comment period was closed, I bit my tongue. Please consider this letter as my public comment.

As coordinator for San Jose Parks Advocates, I speak with park passionate people from throughout the city. While the following suggestions are my own, they do reflect and integrate conversations with other San Jose Park Advocates.

Parks contribute to the health and vitality of the city. These public places serve as the *third place* for many residents, and the family room for those living in small, cramped or dense housing. Properly maintained parks contribute to the economic health of the city through C & C and property tax.

**First, and foremost, San Jose Parks need more money.** A decade of minimal funding has led to a system that does not provide its full value to citizens. Maintenance funding slashes have never been replaced. The infrastructure backlog has grown to over \$100M. Nearly all FTE increases have not come from the General Fund, but have been linked in to parking fees, grants, or the Park Trust Fund. We have identified only 2 new FTEs funded by the General Fund. Recognizing that debt service demands on the General Fund make it impossible to immediately return funding to prior levels, the following long term and incremental changes are suggested.

### **Longer Term Strategies**

#### **1. Complete analysis and Implement citywide park maintenance district.**

When the St. James project came forward in fall 2015, council directed staff to complete an analysis of different types of maintenance districts that could be formed and how they could be funded. The target completion date was December 2016. The Park Commission work plan indicates that this will come forward in Spring 2017. Park Advocates look forward to a discussion of a continuing revenue stream for park maintenance.

**2. Move Forward with Park Bond Issue.** The Mayor has indicated an interest in a June 2018 park bond. This bond provides an opportunity to work on the major infrastructure backlog in addition to more traditional uses for new buildings, new parks, new trails, new equipment. Among the critical parks maintenance projects mentioned by Park Advocates:

- Replace 30 year old irrigation systems with smart remote operated, multizoned systems
- Replace lighting in fields and parks
- Rehabilitate sports fields, but do not convert all to *premiere*
- Additional *senior friendly* walking trails and paths in all parks
- Improved vandal proof fencing
- Purple pipe water to any park within a reasonable nexus
- Improved parking and amenities for high use parks
- Replace older playground equipment
- Rehabilitate selected parks completely
- Replace/resurface tennis and basketball courts
- Rebuild backstops, snackshops, bleachers, bathrooms
- Replant parks with natives, low maintenance, and drought hardy plants
- Utilize park plantings for biofiltration of street stormwater
- Remove and replace trees that have reached the end of their lifespan

**3. Update Park Trust Fund Nexus Study.** With recent renewal of the Downtown High Rise discount, there was a discussion of updating the 1982 Park Trust Fund Nexus study in conjunction with the Greenprint Study. This would provide some more certainties about capital money that may be available in areas of increased densification. It may also reduced the continued requests for fee discounts. Councilmember Peralez indicated that he would allocate money from his Park trust fund account. The council should approve this action.

### **In the Short Term**

**1. Allocate money to Parks from Midyear Budget Adjustments and Year End Balance.** At a recent Development Services Ad Hoc Committee Meeting, council members acknowledged that Parks *takes the hit* when discounts are implemented and that consideration should be made to *share the wealth* among all departments that collect fees. Following this line of reasoning, when there is a positive balance, Parks should be receiving a portion of the funds. Typically, Parks receives its portion of cuts when there is a shortfall, but not when there is a positive balance. Councilmember Rocha wrote a memo to Council recommending that the FY15/16 year end balance be split between Parks and Transportation as both groups have substantial maintenance backlogs. While the public complains more frequently about road repairs, the public merely stops using poorly maintained parks, lowering the health and vitality of the city.

**2. Continue the Finance Department practice of allocating higher dollars per acre for new parks as they come online. Expand the practice to include rebuilt like new facilities,** such as renovated sports fields, new playgrounds, and facilities like the new Lake Cunningham BMX Park. The Finance Department has made this incremental allocation so that new parks may be maintained at an optimum level and not be allowed to decay as with existing parks. A similar logic supports allocating dollars for those rebuilt facilities.

**3. Allocate additional dollars per acre for high use parks.** Downtown and Regional parks already receive additional allocation due to their heavy use for festivals and major events. A handful of community parks throughout the city are very heavily used. Because of their high use, other parks within the same maintenance district suffer and drop below their already low service levels as dollars are shifted to the high use parks. High use parks need additional dollars for field and turf care, garbage collection, trash pickup, and bathroom maintenance.

**4. Fund a second weeding for all street facing perimeter lands of each park.** Currently, staffing allows for a single weeding of each park. It is carried out at the end of the rainy season prior to seed dispersal. As a result, weeds get to 3 feet high and create the impression that the park is not maintained. This gives the neighborhood an appearance of blight. Many turf reduction projects were carried out along the street perimeters. A second, earlier weeding in these perimeter regions would reduce the appearance of blight. A Trust for Public Land study of the Economic Value of Parks show that parks positively impacts residential property values. An appearance of blight impacts the value of adjacent properties and thus C & C and property taxes. Also, weedy parks make the city a bad neighbor.

**5. Continue the 7.75 FTE Capital Projects *Strike Force* team (funded by the Park Trust Fund). Expand the team with General Fund money to cover parks not within the nexus of Park Trust fund monies.** The current strategy limits this cost effective and timely team to just those parks near new housing development. Expanding the team with general fund or C & C dollars would allow them to respond to capital emergencies and projects throughout the city. The expansion could be phased in across multiple fiscal years.

**6. Return to prior watering levels. Fund a 5 year plan to repair the damage to sports fields, turf, and trees caused by this decision.** An unintended consequence of reducing the watering of parks was an increase in the infrastructure backlog. Acres of turf became unusable for active sports as weeds with woody stems crowded out turf plants creating dangerous conditions for players. The water reduction caused the death of hundreds of young and old trees that were dependent on the watering of nearby turf. Additional trees were badly stressed and suffered limb death requiring pruning for safety. Volunteers who had worked so hard to gain grants or fundraise for new young trees were demoralized as their trees died. The Governor ordered a reduction in water use but specifically excluded parkland. In San Jose, our city parks carried the burden of water reduction for the whole city,

which exceeded the target set by the Governor. While trying to model drought appropriate behavior, the City actions created additional costs as the dead trees must be removed and replaced, stressed trees must be pruned, and sports field and turf areas must be rehabbed.

**7. Solve the 20% vacancy problem. Fund cascade hiring capacity in the Human Resources Department. Implement new salary schedule that benchmarks at 75% (not 50%).** This 20% vacancy rate translates to a 20% reduction in maintenance. The vacant positions cause increased stress on staff as they try to do their own overwhelming duties as well as the duties of vacant positions. This leads to more resignations. When a person is promoted, the resulting vacancy continues the problem. Yet, internal promotions are highly motivating for the workforce. Recently, PRNS conducted same day interview/hiring successfully. Other communities and businesses use cascade hiring where interviews and hiring for the chain of vacancies are conducted at the same time. Salary levels are cited as a problem during exit interviews, yet SJ only seeks to benchmark at the 50% level. By the time the new schedule is implemented, the rates are at the 25% level and the problem remains. Combined with workloads and less attractive benefits, San Jose remains undesirable. One strategy would be to benchmark at 75% level; by the time of implementation it would likely be closer to 50% level.

**8. Continue the Business Intelligence program and Analyst position.** This project has the potential for determining exactly what it takes to maintain each type of amenity and more effectively estimate needs for different types of amenities. This can be a powerful cost control strategy as well as a method to allocate resources as they become available.

**9. Continue and expand cross training and apprenticeships. Expand interim classifications.** Due to staff reductions a decade ago, some job categories are staffed with very few qualified personnel. When these positions are vacant due to resignations, retirements, disability, illness, or vacation, repairs stop. Toilets take priority over irrigation. The result is that turf suffers because no one can get to the repair for a month or more. Staff has implemented crossing training and apprenticeships for career ladder growth. Now, there should be *interim* classifications. In this way, a cross trained person could step into this critical vacancy and be paid at that level and then return to their prior position. The definition of *interim* should be extended to allow short periods of time to cover unexpected workload increases as well, e.g. many broken toilets. With the advent of Business Intelligence, the employee can easily record the amount of time spent doing the work of a particular *interim* job classification prior to returning to regular duties.

**10. Continue Adopt a Park program. Coordinate with Volunteer Initiative from the Mayor. Fund analyst time to provide estimates of institutional and**

**community capacity and barriers.** The Adopt a Park program is a useful adjunct to park maintenance but it is not the primary solution. Many projects require many staff members to supervise and direct volunteers while other projects do not. Some volunteer opportunities attract many participants, such as the Rosegarden pruning, while other opportunities attract few, such as some cleanups. Staff analyst time should be funded to investigate the community capacity, e.g. number of high school students, vs. other volunteers. The analyst should also investigate the factors needed to replicate the Rose Garden success, e.g. subsidies from Council office budget, unique resource, established community of passionate Rosarians, more. The analyst should also investigate how other communities attract specialty volunteers, e.g. tennis net repairman, bench and stadium woodworkers, and more. Provide community members with *typical* planting palate and schemes for those interested in Adopting a Spot within a park.

**11. Fund investigation of creative partnerships and philanthropy potential.**

Seek opportunities that expand community access and provide maintenance dollars. Examples may include a fruit orchard operated by a Urban Agriculture advocacy group, similar to the one proposed for the Giamello property in District 5; a demonstration garden sponsored by a commercial grower or nursery in conjunction with a nonprofit or in conjunction with UC Cooperative Extension similar to the one operated at Emma Prusch. Investigate opportunities for funding for job creation for youth or unhoused persons, similar to Downtown Streets Team, Work 2 Future, Conservation Corps, or other training or vocational programs. Avoid partnerships that limit public access or require fees for access.

**12. Address C & C Allocation.** The current C & C allocation is a hodgepodge of political wheeling and dealing dating from its inception. It has been repeatedly criticized by those council members whose districts do poorly under the allocation. Because a change may trigger a vote, no change has been made. Nevertheless, analysis should be made of the allocation and a determination made as to whether some districts should receive additional capital funds to make up for the shortfall. Park Maintenance Conditions should be part of the analysis.

**13. Create and Fund Mobile App for Maintenance.** Currently persons who see broken things must remember to look up the phone number or email Park Concerns. Relatively few things are reported. In contrast, the graffiti app generates many more contacts due to its ease of use. Volunteers may be available to help with this, eg. Code for America.

In summary, the maintenance problem needs new money. Until some sort of maintenance district is implemented, a comprehensive stopgap program of incremental targeted increases combined with creative partnerships will help move the Park System forward.

The trail currently starts at W. Virginia Street, just south of I-280, and goes north for nine miles, passing through the heart of downtown San Jose, past the San Jose Market Center, through Guadalupe River Park, past the Airport, then close by the industrial areas of north San José along the First Street Corridor, and ending in Alviso near the Marina County Park. The Guadalupe River Trail is arguably the most significant trail in the city. In this year's Trail Count, the Trail had the highest number of users of all trails where measurements were made.

It is a major corridor for bicycling commuters on weekdays, and is also a heavily used recreational facility for cyclists, joggers, skateboarders, and families going for a stroll on the weekend.

The Master Plan envisions extending the Trail over four miles to the south, from Virginia Street to Chynoweth Avenue, thereby making the existing Trail connections easily accessible to the population centers along the Highway 87 and Almaden Expressway corridors. The new segment shows every promise for becoming a heavily used extension of this most significant trail.

Several Board Members of **Save Our Trails** attended the public meetings where public input was solicited for the development of the Master Plan for this extension, and we can attest to the careful attention given by the staff of the Department of Parks and Recreation to hearing the issues raised by the public, and responding to all concerns.

In summary, we believe that the Master Plan deserves the enthusiastic support of the Parks and Recreation Commission, and we urge the Commission to report it out favorably.
