CLEAN ENERGY COMMUNITY ADVISORY COMMISSION VACANCIES

APPLICATION DEADLINE: 11:59 P.M.

In May 2017, City Council approved proceeding with the establishment of a San José Community Choice Energy, referred to as San José Clean Energy (SJCE), under a single-jurisdiction model as a separate City department. The launch of the first phase of SJCE is targeted for April 2018. Consistent with many Community Choice Aggregation's SJCE's guiding framework calls for the establishment of a Clean Energy Community Advisory Commission (CECAC). The CECAC will provide essential advice to the Mayor and City Council, City Manager, and the Director about all aspects of SJCE start-up and operations. The City Council will be the final decision-making body. The CECAC acts as expert advisors to the City Council. The CECAC will meet at least quarterly and in the early stages may meet more frequently. As advisors, the members of the CECAC may be asked to:

- Provide feedback and input on the development of strategy and operating principles or models
- Inform the prioritization and development of energy programs
- Identify areas of concern as well as innovative opportunities for reducing carbon emissions
- Monitor best practices of other Community Choice Energy programs, legislative and regulatory issues, and new energy developments
- Be liaisons to the community for purposes of advocacy and outreach.

The commission size is nine and serves four-year terms. Inaugural members will serve staggered terms for purposes of continuity. Approximately half the members will serve 2-year terms and the remaining members will serve 4-year terms.

The composition of the CECAC will reflect the geographic, ethnic, and socio-economic diversity of the San José community. While members would ideally be City of San José residents, Council may consider members from outside the City of San José who could bring expertise to advance the goals of SJCE. Two-thirds of the membership (6) will include those with expertise in community outreach, policy advocacy, and clean energy programs and consideration will be given to representation from industry, labor, education, not-for-profits, environmental associations, and advocacy organizations. The remaining members (3) will be three at-large community members appointed by the Mayor. A non-voting Council member will serve as a liaison.

The Council Appointment Advisory Commission (CAAC), or a subgroup, will review applications and make nominations to the Mayor and Council for 6 of the 9 members. The Mayor will appoint the remaining 3 members and the non-voting Council liaison.

- Two (2) At-Large Seats with a Term Ending December 31, 2021
