Mayor Liccardo Welcomes Hewlett Packard Enterprise's Headquarters to San José

Iconic company plans to move into new 220,000 sq.ft. HQ at the America Center later this year

San Jose, Calif. – Below is a statement from San José Mayor Sam Liccardo congratulating Hewlett Packard Enterprise on the company's decision to locate its new headquarters in San José:

"For over a half-century, Hewlett Packard's technological innovation has helped put Silicon Valley on the map, so I'm thrilled that Hewlett Packard Enterprise has chosen to locate their new headquarters in San José. Thanks to CEO Antonio Neri, as well as Gregg Melinson, Nick Gunn and the rest of the Hewlett Packard Enterprise team, for their investments in our city, and for the jobs and revenues that their new headquarters will generate for our community.

"I'd also like to thank Steelwave and USAA for their partnership in helping bring Hewlett Packard Enterprise to San Jose. We are committed to permitting the company's tenant improvements as expeditiously as possible and meeting the company's timeline to move into its new headquarters."

Hewlett Packard Enterprise's new headquarters will be located at the America Center in North San José, the region's premier tech hub with the highest concentration of technology companies in Silicon Valley.

Nick Gunn, Senior Vice President, Global Corporate Services at Hewlett Packard Enterprise added: *"We are excited about the opportunity to create a purpose-built workspace and customer briefing center that can accommodate more of our people together at one site, and allow for growth and expansion. San José is a growing tech hub and a perfect home for us thanks to Mayor Liccardo and his team, who have developed best-in-class practices not only for attracting business, but also for working at the speed of business."*

The site (6280 American Center Drive) offers convenient access to several public transit options – including Caltrain, the future Berryessa BART Station and VTA Light Rail – as well as Mineta San Jose International Airport. The company will occupy six floors totaling approximately 220,000 sq. ft., with plans to locate approximately 1,000 employees from its existing Bay Area workforce to its new offices.

The company plans to occupy its new offices in late 2018.
