

Anti-Tobacco Master Settlement Agreement	Fund 426
Revenue Fund (Healthy Neighborhoods Venture Fund)	

PURPOSE OF THE FUND:

The Anti-Tobacco Master Settlement Agreement Revenue Fund is used to account for the distribution of the funds received by the City of San José related to the national tobacco settlement. With the involvement of the community, the City Council establishes priorities and criteria to guide the distribution of these funds.

AUTHORITY FOR THE FUND:

San José Municipal Code sections 4.80.1800 through 4.80.1830. Revenue and expenditure estimates are budgeted via Council funding sources resolution and appropriation ordinance, respectively.

SOURCE OF FUNDS:

- Revenue from the Master Settlement Agreement
- Transfers from other funds
- Interest earnings

FUND RESTRICTIONS:

This fund is not subject to Proposition 218 requirements. Because the master settlement agreement did not impose restrictions on the use of the settlement proceeds, the Council may amend the Municipal Code to change the use of the funds.

The City Council may transfer monies from the Anti-Tobacco Master Settlement Agreement Revenue Fund to any other fund that may be used for the purpose set forth in Municipal Code section 4.80.1800 through 4.80.1830.

By City Council policy, interest earnings are to be set aside in a reserve to be expended only after all settlement proceeds have been received by the City.
