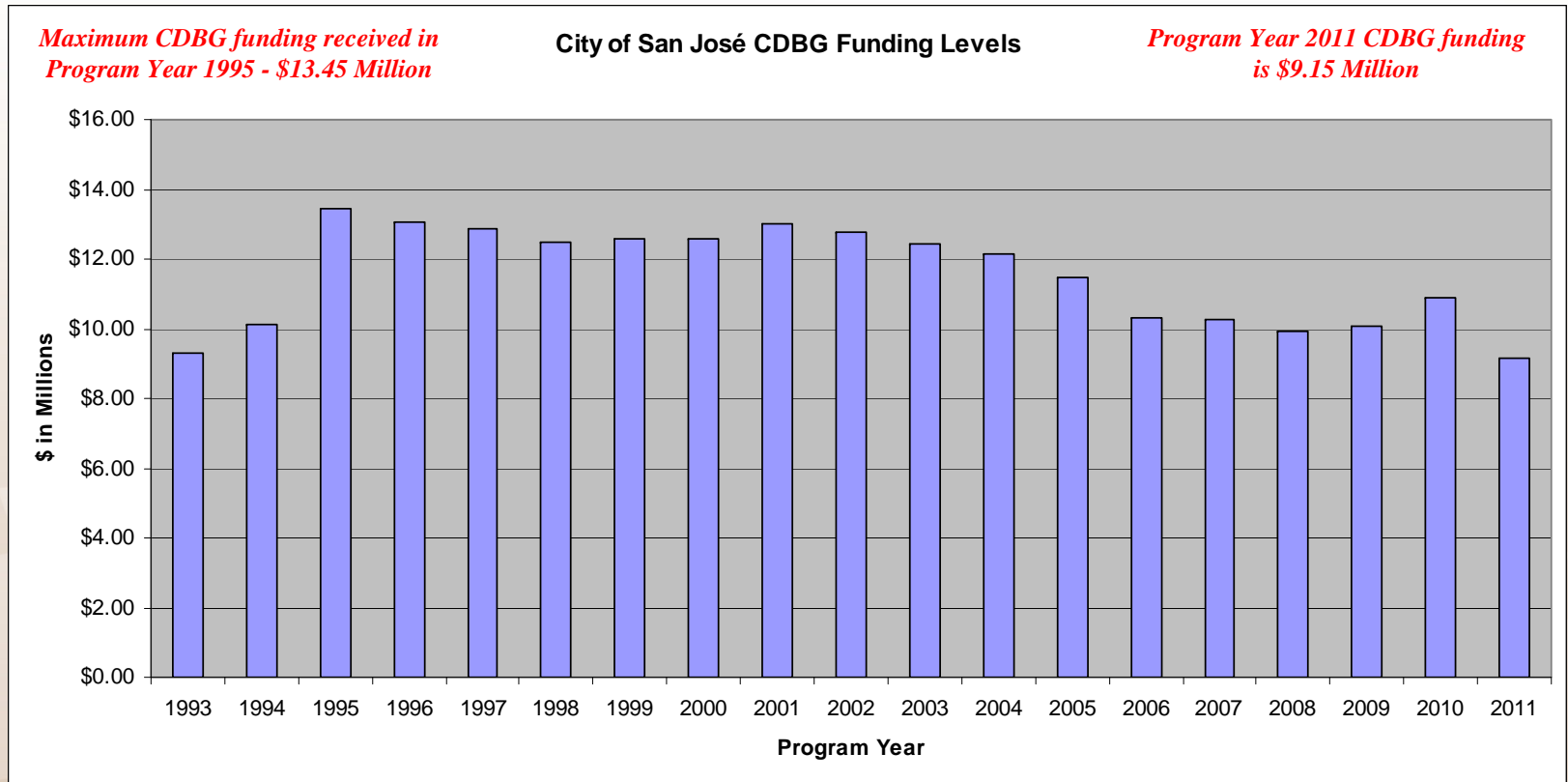

# Community Development Block Grant

- General Overview
- Funds primarily for housing, infrastructure & economic development programs
- Must meet a national objective
- Limitations on public service & administration

# Eligible Activities

1. Public Services (15%)
2. Housing Activities
3. Code Enforcement
4. Economic Development
5. Grant Administration (20%)
6. Section 108 Payments
7. Other Real Property Activities
8. Public Facilities Improvements
9. Planning Activities

# Ineligible Activities

- Building costs for the general conduct of government
- General government expenses
- Financing activities
- Political activities
- On-going income payments to individuals
- New housing construction
