1. Welcome, Introductions and Adoption of the April 23, 2010 Policy Team Minutes

Mayor Chuck Reed began the meeting at 7:30 am with members of the Task Force and public introducing themselves. Mayor Reed called for adoption of the April 23, 2010 minutes.

Upon a motion by CM Nguyen the Task Force passed the adoption of the April 23, 2010 minutes unanimously.

2. Climate Discussion

Lt. Millard provided the gang climate report on behalf of the SJP. Lt. Millard noted that although gang climate has been steady in previous months there was a gang related shooting in the morning before the MGPTF meeting.

3. Subcommittee Updates

Cora Tomalinas reported on behalf of the community engagement subcommittee. At the last subcommittee meeting there was discussion on the Mayor's current faith initiative which launched with over 50 faith leaders on May 19, 2010. The subcommittee also discussed possible dates for the 2011 crime and gang prevention summit.

Angel Rios reported on behalf of the interagency subcommittee meeting. The interagency subcommittee reported that there was soft opening of the MARC (Multi Alter Reception Center) earlier in the month. Additionally, there will be a grand opening with congressman Honda on August 11, 2010. The subcommittee is also discussing the states early release program.

Angel Rios also reported on the request made from the Tech Team subcommittee in reference to community centers located with in hot spot areas. Per council directions those community centers will be funded for 1 additional year to service those needed areas.

Norberto Duenas reported on behalf of the city/school collaborative. At the last city/school collaborative the committee discussed school facility use agreements with Community Based Organizations per the Tech Team subcommittee referral.

4 Youth PSA

The community engagement subcommittee presented the Youth PSA to the policy team. Mario Maciel, superintendent of the MGPTF presented the District 7 Youth Advisory Commission which showcased their project "Ignorance is not bliss"

5. State of California Early Release program

Brenda Crowding, presented the State of California Early release program. Chief Davis inquired If the State was tracking the number of parolees who are placed on Non-Revocable Parole (NRP) status who get re-arrested locally? and what are some clearer percentages on the number of parolees who are being placed on NRP?

Ms. Crowding did not have an immediate answer to the questions, but will follow up with Chief Davis and Task Force members on the questions.

6. Work2future

Jeff Ruster presented to the MGPTF regarding the summer work program from Work2Future. With funding from the workforce investment act (Federal Stimulus Funding) over 1000 youths were able to get summer time jobs with emphasis on green jobs and green careers. Youth must be low income and meet the requirements to apply for the program.
