- Review Council direction and Public Intoxication Task Force (PITF) purpose: To recommend solutions for "non-criminal sanctions and alternatives to 647(f) arrests" and "objective evidence to support arrests."

- The PITF will produce two products: (1) A set of recommendations in response to Council's direction, and (2) a set of additional ideas and proposals for addressing the situation that are outside of Council's charge.
- These two products will be organized into three categories: (1) Recommendations for alternatives to arrest, (2) recommendations for procedures regarding objective evidence, and (3) members' ideas including long-term proposals for Council consideration.
- Given the short time frame (two more meetings remaining after 2/26), we will use tonight's meeting to focus on recommendations for alternatives to arrest and procedures regarding objective evidence, and reserve time at the final meeting (3/12) to discuss additional ideas and long-term proposals.

- Identify the potential recommendations that PITF members want to investigate further for possible inclusion in the final recommendations to Council.
