



**PUBLIC NOTICE
INTENT TO ADOPT A NEGATIVE DECLARATION
CITY OF SAN JOSÉ, CALIFORNIA**

New Harvest, Southwest corner of Ridder Park Drive and Fox Lane (File No. GP09-04-01)

The applicant, New Harvest Christian Fellowship, is proposing an amendment to the General Plan to add the Mixed Industrial Overlay to a 3.5 acre site designated Industrial Park on the San Jose General Plan 2020 Land Use/Transportation diagram. The project is located in Council District: 4

California State Law requires the City of San José to conduct environmental review for all pending projects. Environmental review examines the nature and extent of any potentially significant adverse effects on the environment that could occur if a project is approved and implemented. Based on an initial study, the Director of Planning, Building & Code Enforcement has concluded that the project described above will not have a significant effect on the environment. The project location **does not** contain a listed toxic site.

The purpose of this notice is to inform the public of the Director's intent to adopt a Mitigated Negative Declaration for the proposed project on May 26, 2009, and to provide an opportunity for public comments on the draft Mitigated Negative Declaration. The public review period for this draft Mitigated Negative Declaration begins on **May 5, 2009** and ends on **May 26, 2009**. Adoption of a Negative Declaration does not constitute approval of the proposed project. The decision to approve or deny the project described above will be made separately as required by City Ordinance.
