Thank you for the opportunity to review the MND for the proposed Project. The State Water Resources Control Board, Division of Drinking Water (State Water Board) is responsible for issuing water supply permits administered under the Safe Drinking Water Act and will require a new or amended water supply permit for the above referenced Project. A project requires a permit if it includes water system consolidation or changes to a water supply source, storage, or treatment. The State Water Board is a responsible agency pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and considers the above referenced document as adequate to meet water supply permit CEQA requirements.

The proposed Project includes removing and replacing of the existing 19.6-million gallon reservoir for potable water storage with the installation of two 5-million gallon pre-stressed concrete tanks. Additional supporting infrastructure including piping for potable and non-potable water, two 7.5 horsepower centrifugal pumps, a storm water treatment planter, a bladder tank, a soil retaining structure, access roads, and solar panels. The proposed Project would also involve the remediation of hazardous materials in the existing storm water sump. Finally, the removal of up to 61 ordinance-sized trees and 22 non-ordinance sized trees to accommodate the construction of the new tanks and supporting infrastructure on an approximate 6.53-gross acre site. The San Jose Water Company will pay for the off-site replacement of 146 trees in accordance with the City of San Jose's tree ordinance. The proposed Project will be constructed in three (3) phases. Phase 1 will comprise of decommissioning and demolishing the existing reservoir, and the construction of Tank 1. Phase 2 will comprise of moving excavated soil from Tank 1 and Tank 2, and the construction of Tank 2. Additional supporting infrastructure improvements will also occur. Phase 3 will involve backfilling soil around Tank 2 and final grading around both tanks. Paved and graveled road will also be constructed. Finally replacement trees will be planted on-site.

When the review process has ended, please forward the following items with your permit application to the Santa Clara District Office:

- Copy of the Resolution or Board Minutes certifying and adopting the MND;
- Copy of the stamped Notice of Determination (NOD) filed at the Santa Clara County Clerk's Office;
