If you wish to speak, please refer to the following guidelines:

- Questions and comments will be taken at the end of the meeting during Open Forum.
- Please raise your hand to speak. Speakers will be called upon by staff.
- Depending on the number of speakers, each person will be called upon to speak only once. If time allows a speaker may be called upon more than once.
- Persons in the audience will refrain from behavior which disrupts the public meeting or which may intimidate others who wish to voice their opinions. This will include making loud noises, clapping, shouting, booing, hissing or engaging in any other activity in a manner that disturbs, disrupts or impedes the orderly conduct of the meeting.
- Persons in the audience will refrain from creating, provoking or participating in any type of disturbance involving unwelcome physical contact.
- Harassment of meeting participants including City staff will not be tolerated in any form. If a participants engage in harassing behavior, City Staff will end the meeting.
