BPAC Staff Report: Project Updates

Pavement Maintenance Bikeways

Construction for Meridian, Cherry, and Pine has been delayed to Spring 2021 due to contractor availability constraints. The design for Fruitdale west of Del Mar Avenue is under consideration with VTA due to significant signal modifications that would be necessary for a full lane reduction on Fruitdale Ave.

Better Bikeways

10th/11th

10th and 11th Streets have been paved and markings are scheduled for mid-October. There is a multi-month implementation schedule for 10th and 11th Streets.

San Antonio

The concrete islands and artwork on E San Antonio St. is complete and paving is scheduled for mid-October. Markings will be completed by the end of October.

Red Bollards at Fire Hydrants

New red bollards have been added to existing protected bike lanes on San Fernando, San Salvador, San Carlos, 3rd, and 4th Streets in Downtown San Jose to prevent vehicle intrusion into the bike lane. The bollards will be placed by the end of October.

Bike Plan:

The Better Bike Plan 2025 was approved unanimously at the October 6th City Council meeting with strong support from council members and the public. BPACs letter of support was included in the agenda packet. Mayor Liccardo and Councilmembers Peralez, Carrasco, Davis, and Esparza submitted a memo in support of the Bike Plan emphasizing the need for a low-stress network, swift plan implementation, and east-west connections. Shared Micro-mobility:

The City currently only has two e-scooter operators due to reduced ridership because of COVID-19, a reduction from six operators permitted from June 2019 through June 2020. Albeit the current situation, Staff is evaluating new micro-mobility partners that can meet the City's safety and equity goals, including minimizing sidewalk riding and expanding access programs for low income communities. Additionally, Staff has developed a data management strategy to

facilitate planning and enforcement of e-scooter regulations and continues to plan and develop on-street shared micro-mobility corrals to minimize conflicts with pedestrians.
