Declaring Result
Municipal Election
April 13, 1954

Resolution No. 10286.1 determining and declaring that George Starbird and Fred Watson, received a majority of the vote cast at Municipal Election held April 13, 1954, for candidates for the office of Councilman, four-year term, three to be elected, and are hereby declared elected, and the City Clerk is authorized and directed to issue a certificate of election and administer the oath of office to George Starbird and Fred Watson as Councilmen, four-year term; that Paul Moore and Joseph L. Pace, M.D., are the candidates twice in number to be elected who received the highest vote, but not a majority vote of the vote cast at said election for candidates for the office of Councilman, four-year term, one to be elected, to appear on the ballot at the Municipal Election on May 11, 1954; that John H. Dunlea, Hanford Eldh, James Patrick Igoe and Barney M. Martino, candidates for the office of Councilman, four-year term, did not receive a vote requisite for election, or for certification as candidate for office of Councilman, to appear on the ballot at the Municipal Election on May 11, 1954 and are declared not elected to the office of Councilman; that the question, "Shall Anthony P. Hamann, the City Manager of San Jose, be retained in office for the ensuing two years?" received the affirmative vote of the majority of the qualified electors voting at said election on said question; that Proposition 1, "Shall the City Council of the City of San Jose be authorized, pursuant to the provisions of Section 136 of Article XX of the Charter of the City of San Jose, to sell at public auction to the highest responsible bidder such property heretofore or hereafter acquired through tax assessments or tax delinquencies, and which are not needed for municipal purposes, in order that said property might revert to the tax rolls of the City of San Jose?" received the affirmative vote of the majority of the qualified electors voting at said election on said proposition; that Proposition 2, "Shall the City Council of the City of San Jose be authorized to sell to the highest responsible bidder at public auction the following designated properties upon their abandonment for fire house purposes, should the Council find and determine that they are not needed for any other municipal purpose: (a) All that real property together with improvements thereon consisting of a structure used for fire house purposes located at 620 South First Street and commonly referred to

as Engine #3? (b) All that real property together with improvements thereon consisting of a structure used for fire house purposes located at 254 Spencer Avenue and commonly referred to as Engine #4? (c) All that real property together with improvements thereon consisting of a structure used for fire house purposes located at 61 North Third Street", received the affirmative vote of the majority of the qualified electors voting at said election on said proposition, is presented and upon motion of Councilman Starbird, seconded by Councilman Santora, adopted:
