- ***Transportation & Aviation Services*** — A safe and efficient transportation system that contributes to the livability and economic health of the City; and provide for the air transportation needs of the community and the region at levels that is acceptable to the community.
- ***Environment and Utility Services*** — Manage environmental services and utility systems to ensure a sustainable environment for the community.
- ***Public Safety Services*** — Commitment to excellence in public safety by investing in neighborhood partnerships as well as prevention, enforcement, and emergency preparedness services.

You may speak to the City Council about any discussion item that is on the agenda, and you may also speak during Open Forum on items that are not on the agenda and are within the subject matter jurisdiction of the City Council. If you wish to speak to the City Council, please refer to the following guidelines:

- **Fill out a Yellow Speaker's Card and submit it to the City Clerk seated at the front table. Do this before the meeting or before the item is heard.** This will ensure that your name is called for the item(s) that you wish to address, and it will help ensure the meeting runs smoothly for all participants.
- When the Council reaches your item on the agenda, Mayor Reed will open the public hearing and call your name. Please address the Council from the podium, which is located to the left of the City Clerk's table.
- Each speaker generally has two minutes to speak per item. The amount of time allotted to speakers may vary at the Mayor's discretion, depending on the number of speakers or the length of the agenda.
- To assist you in tracking your speaking time, there is a display on the podium. The green light turns on when you begin speaking; the yellow light turns on when you have 30 seconds left; and the red light turns on when your speaking time is up.

Please be advised that, by law, the City Council is unable to discuss or take action on issues presented during Open Forum. According to State Law (the Brown Act) items must first be noticed on the agenda before any discussion or action.

The San José City Council meets every Tuesday at 1:30 p.m. and Tuesday at 7 p.m. as needed, unless otherwise noted. 11.7 Rezoning the Real Property Located on the North Side of the Alameda, Approximately 315 Feet Westerly of Stockton Avenue.

Recommendation: Consideration of an ordinance rezoning the real property located on the north side of the Alameda approximately 315 feet westerly of Stockton Ave (785 The Alameda) from a recently approved A(PD) Planned Development Zoning District which allowed 70 dwelling units and 22, 651 square feet of commercial to a new A(PD) Planned Development Zoning District which will allow 140 dwelling units and 22,651 square feet of commercial. This change in unit count is a result of decreasing the amount of two (2) and (3) bedroom units and increasing the number of one bedroom and studio units; and consideration of a resolution approving a Planned Development Permit to allow the demolition of an existing building and the construction of a 140 multi-family attached residence building and a 22, 651 square feet of commercial space for a 1.04 gross acre site (785 The Alameda LLC, Owner). Items 10.2 (Amendment on a 1.4 Gross Acre Site Located on the South East Corner of Goodyear Street and Pepitone Avenue), 11.2 (Conventional Rezoning Real Property Located on the South East Corner of Goodyear Street and Pepitone Avenue) and 11.3 (Agreement with Launchpad Development Company for Construction of Rocketship Tamien Public School) from the November 19, 2013 City Council Agenda were deferred to an August 2014 City Council Meeting and subsequently withdrawn from consideration.
